• HELPING PEOPLE MAKE A DIFFERENCE FOR NATURE

We believe in the transformative power of nature, in its generosity and splendor. We believe that our progress depends on making sure that we protect it. But with one of the lowest rates of land conservation in the world, Puerto Rico needs a plan to ensure the wellbeing of all its inhabitants – human and otherwise. So The Conservation Trust of Puerto Rico created a new unit -Para la Naturaleza- and tasked it with a lofty dream: conserving 33% of Puerto Rico's territory by 2033.

CONSERVING LAND

At Para la Naturaleza, we protect lands and ecosystems of high ecological value, we encourage people to take responsibility for all our natural resources, and we push forward conservation public policy. With help from thousands of volunteers and other allies, we encourage and guide one and all to take conservation into their own hands to move us closer to our common goal: a sustainable future for Puerto Rico.


